WHAT IS URBAN PLANTING?

THE URBAN LANDSCAPE




"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

MATTHEW 28:19-20



When you think of the word 'urban', you might picture vibrant city centres like London, Cardiff, Glasgow or Belfast.

However, urbanisation has expanded far beyond the major cities. An increase in national and global mobility has seen the diverse mix of nationalities, cultures and socio-economic backgrounds normally confined to big city centres reproducing across our neighbourhoods, estates, suburbs and towns with significant effects.



As the nations move into the neighbourhood, the oncefamiliar stories of these everyday places is quickly changing.

It is increasingly clear that people and their communities are broken. The places where we live, work, rest and play are in need of authentic disciples who embody Jesus in the day-today of everyday life.

People and communities are separated and unknown to one another, rarely working together towards the same goals and outcomes. People feel lost in the busyness of the crowd and remain strangers, divided by their difference. There seems to be a widening gap between those with hopes, aspirations and opportunities, and those without. Increasing numbers of people feel isolated and alone, with a deepening loss of meaning and purpose in life.

UP is our humble attempt towards making Jesus known in urban communities like these.

Defining Urban

For somewhere to be classed as urban, we would suggest that the location and people will match at least 2-3 of the following features:

Location



- √ A city, town or estate
- ✓ High population density
 A large number of people live in a relatively small geographic area.
- ✓ Extremes of poverty/wealth

 The poor & the rich exist in close proximity.
- ✓ Signs of social deprivation

 Brokenness is visible. The local community lacks access to essential resources, opportunities, or support.

People



√ Visible diversity

There is a wide range of people from different backgrounds, cultures, races, and identities.

✓ Anonymity

Despite living so closely to others, many people live and feel unknown/unseen and are strangers to their neighbours.

√ Lack of social cohesion

People don't feel connected or united; they're not really working together or for each other.

√ Mobility & transiency

People constantly move around. Nothing is fixed. The only thing that stays the same is change!

WHOIS UP FOR?

UP is for all missionally-minded, gospel-hearted people who want to plant the gospel in urban settings. UP is for those who are prepared to think differently, live radically, walk faithfully and labour diligently.

UP IS FOR YOU IF YOU ARE...

- ...an individual, couple or group with a desire to share the gospel in an urban context.
- ...already based in an urban context or reaching into one nearby, OR planning to be in the future.
- ...willing to invest two-years being spiritually and practically equipped to help you effectively reach urban communities and bear long-lasting fruit.

Who is UP for?



Individuals, couples and households wanting to plant the gospel in their neighbourhood (either where they already live, or somewhere they are called to in future).



Those who lead or have responsibility for house groups, missional communities or gospel plants and want to be equipped with tools to help their community make a significant impact.

WHAT IS UP?

TRAINING PROGRAME

How UP will prepare you

Over two years, UP will equip and encourage you in the principles of missional pioneering, enabling you to discern where God is already at work and help you to plant the seeds of the gospel deep in the soil of your unique urban setting.

Training Overview

Core components of UP school

- Training takes place over two years
- x3 in-person training weekends per year (Friday evening through to Sunday afternoon)
- · Peer group mentoring
- Training developed & delivered by urban planters
- Pastoral support & insight at training weekends
- Spirit-filled insight & moments of prophetic input
- Supplementary resources (online & suggested reading lists)



Mission modules

Each residential weekend comprises a blend of content from across five modules:

1. Theology of Mission

What does the Bible teach and instruct us about God, ourselves, and our Spirit-empowered mission to those we live amongst?

We will explore Biblical themes, alongside historical and contemporary church examples of God's missional heart in reaching the unreached.

2. The Missional Disciple

Exploring the formational role of discipleship in living a fruitful missional life that imitates and honours Jesus.

What are the foundational traits, habits and practices of disciples who make disciples?

4. Kingdom Collaboration

How might we co-labour with others towards the same ends and same goals in seeing Jesus made known in the places where we work, rest & play?

Jesus has promised that as we parter in unity with others, it will command His blessing.

5. Unique Urban Challenges

Every context presents its own unique urban challenges.

We will explore and discern how Gospel truth intersects with contextual culture, opening up opportunities for Jesus to be made known and glorified, even in the hardest to reach places!

3. Communities of Mission

The Trinity is an outward facing transformative community of sending mission, one into which we have been warmly welcomed.

Likewise, we too are called to live armsoutstretched, outward facing, sent into the world to warmly invite others to experience Jesus through Spirit-filled community and our everyday transformational relationships.

Dates & Locations

UP will be facilitated across three unique urban settings: London, Sheppey and Liverpool. They will each host two residential weekends across the two-year programme.

CAMDEN, LONDON

The Church in Bassett Street recently re-planted and re-oriented towards a fresh vision to love and reach their surrounding streets and estates of North London with the good news of Jesus.

SHEPPEY, KENT

Good News Church Sheppey is a growing Gospel Community that was planted in 2018 with the dream of seeing Jesus made known in one of the UK's most deprived towns. The church love and serve Sheppey in a multitude of practical ways and have seen numbers of people come to faith in Jesus.

KENSINGTON, LIVERPOOL

The Liverpool Gospel Plant began when two families relocated their lives from Norfolk, with a vision of sharing Jesus with the communities of Kensington. The area is home to approx. 16,500 people, many of whom are yet to encounter Jesus.


Jay Eastman

2024/26 Annual Programme Fees

UP is intended to serve wide and far, not only those amongst our Relational Mission family of churches, but also collaborating with other streams, spheres and denominations.

We also believe UP should be financially accessible, so we have priced this first two-year programme to hopefully make that possible. Therefore, group discounts are available to encourage and enable more than one person to attend from each setting.

We recognise the family unit as the hub of urban mission, and often (but not always) couples pioneer together. Attending together causes each training weekend to become an opportunity to step away from the hustle and bustle of everyday life and be equipped and encouraged together.

*Please note: Delegates are responsible for organising their own travel, accommodation and meals.
